


# Key commitments for quality assurance (and EHEA)

### **EHEA today**



- 48 countries
- 38 million students:
   56 % in Russia, Turkey,
   Germany, France and UK
- 1.2 % GDP public expenditure (average)





## **Key Commitments:**

Not more important than other commitments, but more prioritised

- 3 cycle degree structure
- Recognition
- Quality Assurance

Challenges to be addressed over next 2 years through peer support...





## **Quality Assurance**

- Why is it important for EHEA?
   For EHEA to work, need to be able to trust higher education systems
- Key conditions for trust:
  - **Robust internal QA**
  - Independent external QA systems
  - Working in compliance with European Standards and Guidelines





## Key indicator: stage of development of QA system


QA system in operation but not aligned to ESG

QA system, but only some HEIs subject to QA via EQAR agency QA system aligned to ESG but agency not registered on EQAR

All HEIs QA via EQAR registered agency

# **Potential pitfalls on Key Commitments**

- 1) Countries won't turn green by 2020 as a result of peer support
- 2) Through concentrating on key commitments we neglect others (esp social dimension)
- 3) False sense of security
  - If key commitments turn green, our EHEA dreams will come true...





#### But will our dreams come true?

1999

Understandable degree structures, and QA will lead to automatic recognition and high levels of mobility

2018

Degree structures are mostly understandable, QA has evolved dramatically, and all but 1 country has ratified Lisbon Recognition Convention...





# And yet...

- EHEA open and inclusive?
- Mobility:
  - Degree mobile students 2.8 % within EHEA
  - Credit mobility data not available in BPIR, but Eurostat data is now available for some EU countries
- 9 out of 10 students are (probably) not mobile in EHEA





#### **Social Dimension**

#### Reality has not changed in recent years:


- Under-representation of students from more
   "deprived" backgrounds, and greater risk of drop-out
- Gender imbalances in certain disciplines
- Lifelong learning (flexible provision) not a reality






# Portability of Student Support (2003 commitment)
